WHAT IS A VALUES-BASED SUPPLY CHAIN?

... enhance small and midscale farmers' financial viability by capturing price premiums in the marketplace for the environmental, economic, and social benefits (values) embedded in the products. They require that all partners in the chain work together to optimize value for everyone. Finally, in this system, partners maintain transparency throughout the supply chain by sharing information at each stage of the chain. (Feenstra, Allen, Hardesty, Ohmart, & Perez, 2011, p. 71)




OUR STUDY

- 3. Opportunities and challenges associated with developing and operating artisan grains value-chains.




KEY:

SHARED & COMPATIBLE VALUES

- Flavor
- Craft
- Environmental Stewardship
- Return on Investment
- Commitment to Place
- Consumer Education

While values are shared, the priority or weight of each value varies by participant.





OWNERSHIP MATTERS

SHARED POWER & DECISION-MAKING

"I really like that structure [worker-farmer owned cooperative] and it just kind of helps make those that are really involved, able to help control the business that they're part of, and benefit from it..."

- Workers eligible for equity investment after one year of employment
- Shared decision making
- Transparency
- Fair wages & return on investment





EQUITY & ACCESS

A fair return on investment for each participant in the values-based supply chain affects the final price of the product.

Focusing on reducing the costs of local and regionally produced products as a means of increasing access replicates the approach, efficiencies, and the failures, of conventional food system.

When the goal is to produce cheap food, it is not possible to have a food supply chain where everyone earns a fair return on investment.
